

NOTICE TO AIRPORT USERS
PROPOSED AIRPORT IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS
Madera Municipal Airport, Madera, California

Project Description and Justification

As per Order 5100.38D Section 3-20 Consultation with Airport Users. The City of Madera proposes to request Airport Improvement Program Grant funds for the following projects at Madera Municipal Airport, Madera, California. While this notification does not require users to provide input or agree with the proposed projects, the City is providing a reasonable opportunity for users to provide input to the proposals listed below.

Reconstruct General Aviation Apron Phase II (Aprons A4 and A5). The pavements in the existing general aviation apron are more than 30 years old. These pavements are cracked, weathered, and, in some instances, showing signs of incipient failure. It is proposed to reconstruct this apron in three phases. This project includes Phase II reconstruction, which consists of Aprons A4 and A5.

It is not feasible to adjust finished grade on this apron due to the proximity of adjacent buildings and taxiways. It is, therefore, necessary to reconstruct the total apron to new grades that match critical fixed grades at the sides of the apron. It is proposed to pulverize the existing pavement section, remove the existing pulverized asphalt and aggregate base, stockpile it, and reuse it as subbase course in the new pavement section.

The pavement section will be designated to accommodate moderate sized jet aircraft and single and dual engine propeller-driven aircraft.

Project Date: The design of this project is scheduled to occur in 2016.

Impacts: Construction is scheduled to last 40 working days. Aprons A4 and A5 will be closed during the construction of this project. There will be no other impacts and the airport will remain open the entire time of construction.

Total Project Cost: \$1,570,000 with 90% funding through FAA Airport Improvement Grant.
